











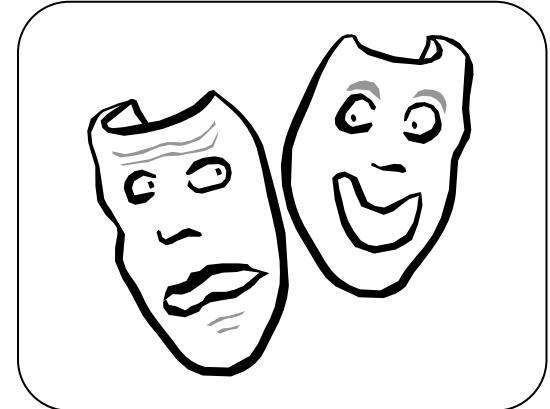

To enhance education and community ties through the advancement of the theater arts.

FILLING A VACUUM:

TheaterHub grew out of one parent's question, "How can I find out about shows at other schools?"

School theater programs have tended to go it alone in their regions unlike sports leagues built through competition. Wouldn't it be better for the students if there were cross-pollination among production staff and among student peers? And wouldn't it be great if a broad community following could be engendered?

TheaterHub's public face is a production calendar of which shows are happening each week. It is especially directed to encourage student travel to other productions with the expectation that peers will inspire one another. Its value to student learning is incalculable. One can hope that by encouraging attendance at college and community theater productions the next generation of theatergoers will grow accustomed to attending and perhaps become active with these other forms of local theater.

The fourth "R," that of the arts, merits greater recognition in a liberal arts curriculum. The future of the arts in our society rests in a large part on the investment our schools make in instilling an appreciation of the arts in the young. TheaterHub is concerned with increasing theater arts opportunities for all youth, especially for those whose circumstances tend to exclude them. The arts are not something extra; they are as central to a well rounded society as they are for an individual regardless of ability or outlook.

In addition to its calendar TheaterHub:

- * Acts as a resource to encourage networking among and beyond theater programs
- * Provides a list of resources targeted to the needs of educational and non-professional theater advocates, and
- * Provides a county by county list of theaters from the very small to the large and other local theater arts resources, which includes links to theater arts-related youth programs including summer camps.

The effort began in 2004 in one county. Since then coverage has expanded to the eight counties of south central PA (Adams, Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Lancaster, Lebanon, Perry and York) and from high schools exclusively to include middle schools, colleges and volunteer community theaters. The goal is comprehensive regional coverage of anything theater with a focus on the little guys.

WHAT IS THE HUB?:

TheaterHub is about information sharing. It is a volunteer run collaborative effort among the staff of school drama clubs and theater programs, and those at the region's colleges and theaters. It also calls on those who advocate for education and community development through the theater arts.

If you have a desire to get involved in developing some aspect of the TheaterHub mission, let's talk. If you have energy to begin something in another region, let's talk. If you want to know where to go for a show, great! Spread the word.

School and Community TheaterHub is unique.

Its focus is comprehensive regional inclusion of educational and amateur theaters and groups exploring drama.

Its interest is process rather than product.

It crosses into wider community engagement and development issues.
